### DECISION AND CONDITIONS

The Urban Planning and Design Division **approves** the application for a Conditional Use under Zoning By-Law No. 200/2006 to permit:

- 1) a Neighbourhood Rehabilitation Home use;
- 2) an accessory Social Service Facility use.

Subject to the following conditions:

1. That there shall be no parking spaces or parking driveways permitted to be established within 20 feet of the south lot line abutting McDermot Avenue.
2. That the development shall be constructed in substantial conformance with the plans submitted under File No. DCU 24-278889\C, dated April 30, 2025, and thereafter maintained to the satisfaction of the Director of Planning, Property and Development;

OR

That the Owner must submit plans showing the location and design of any and all proposed:

- i. buildings;
- ii. accessory parking areas;
- iii. driveways;
- iv. garbage enclosures;
- v. fencing;
- vi. freestanding signage and
- vii. landscaping

on the Owner's Land ("Works") to the Director of Planning, Property and Development for approval prior to the issuance of any building or development permit, and thereafter must

construct the Works in substantial conformance with the approved plans and maintain the Works to the satisfaction of the Director.

3. That if any development granted by the Order is not established within two (2) years of the date thereof, the Order, in respect of that Conditional Use shall terminate.

## REASON FOR THE REPORT

- The applicant is proposing to build a Neighbourhood Rehabilitation Home and accessory Social Service Facility in an 18-unit mixed-use residential and commercial building which requires Conditional Use application to meet requirements of the *Winnipeg Zoning By-Law*.
- This report provides information regarding the subject application's compliance with *The City of Winnipeg Charter*, section 249.

## HISTORY

*DCU 21-251316\C & DAV 21-251319\C*

- On March 18, 2022, The Lord Selkirk West Kildonan Community Committee approved a Conditional Use application to permit a Neighbourhood Rehabilitation Home use.
- The committee also approved an associated Variance application for 22 parking spaces instead of 26 parking spaces.

## DISCUSSION

### CRITERIA FOR APPROVAL

Pursuant to Section 247(3) of *The City of Winnipeg Charter*, an application for a Conditional Use with respect to a property may be approved if the Conditional Use:

- (a) is consistent with *Plan Winnipeg* and any applicable secondary plan;
- (b) does not create a substantial adverse effect on the amenities, use, safety and convenience of the adjoining property and adjacent area, including an area separated from the property by a street or waterway;
- (d) is compatible with the area in which the property to be affected is situated.

### SITE DESCRIPTION

- The subject site is located on the east side of Kate Street, west side of Juno Street, north of McDermot Avenue, in the West Alexander neighbourhood of the Point Douglas ward.
- The property has a “T” shape configuration, as it extends east/west from Kate Street to Juno Street, and a portion of the property extends south to McDermot avenue. A public lane runs along the north side of the property.
- Currently on the property is a five storey former industrial/warehouse building with a sixth floor addition, and accessory parking area with a private approach from Juno Street.
- The site is within the Established Neighbourhood – Mature Community policy area under the *Complete Communities Direction Strategy 2.0*, and is designated Medium Density Residential in the *West Alexander & Centennial Neighbourhood Plan* and Planned Development Overlay.
- The site is zoned "RMF-S PDO-1 West Alexander Centennial" Residential Multi-Family (Small) District under the *Winnipeg Zoning By-law*.

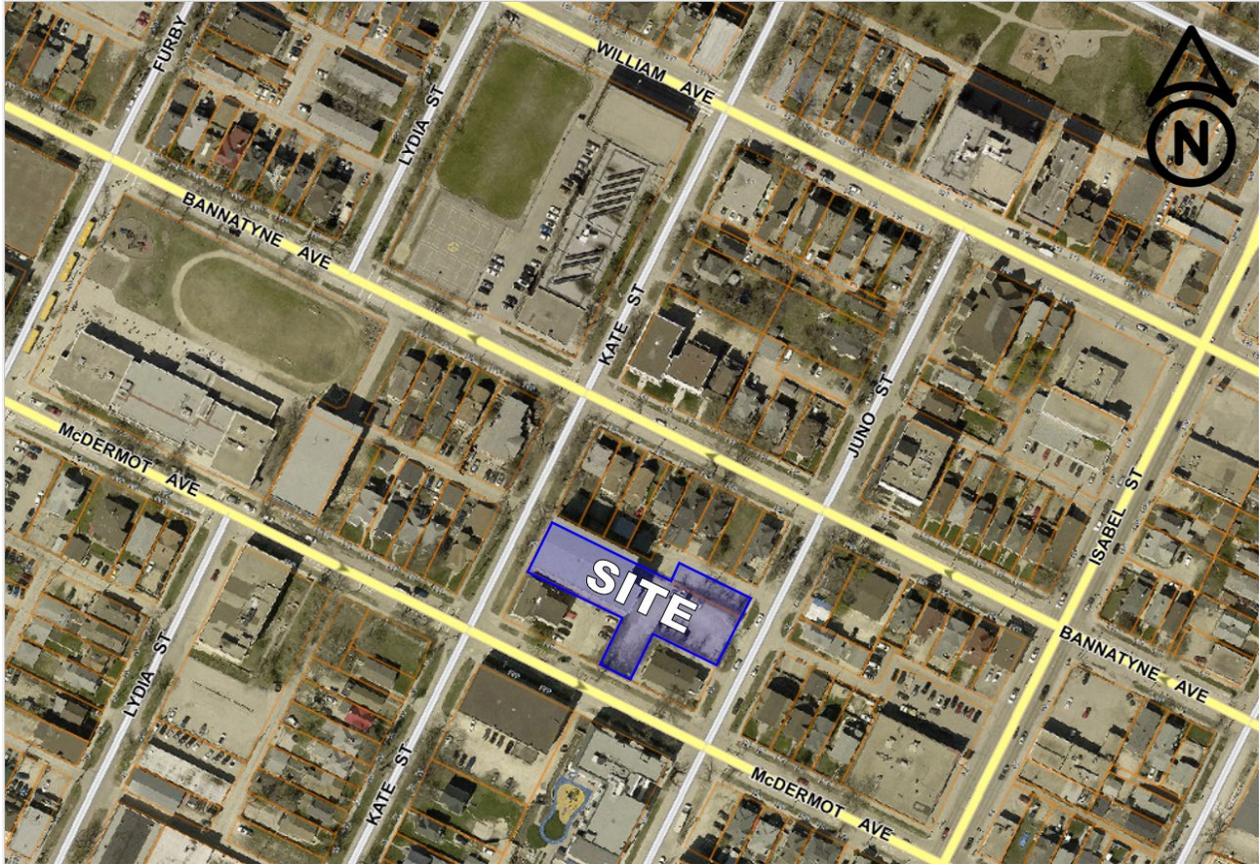


Figure 1: Aerial photo of subject site and surrounding area (flown 2024)

**SURROUNDING LAND USE AND ZONING (See Figure 2)**

- North:** Public lane; then single-family dwellings fronting onto Bannatyne Avenue, zoned "RMF-S PDO-1 West Alexander Centennial" Residential Multi-Family (Small) District.
- South:** Multi-family dwelling (10-units) zoned "RMF-S PDO-1 West Alexander Centennial" Residential Multi-Family (Small), and a place of worship use zoned "C2" Commercial Community; and then McDermot Avenue. South of McDermot is an industrial warehouse building, as well as an Assisted Living Facility (Ronald McDonald House), both zoned "RMF-S PDO-1 West Alexander Centennial" Residential Multi-Family (Small).
- East:** Juno Street; then a mix of residential uses include single-family dwellings, two-family dwellings, and multi-family dwellings, all zoned "RMF-S PDO-1 West Alexander Centennial" Residential Multi-Family (Small) District.
- West:** Kate Street; then residential uses zoned "RMF-S PDO-1 West Alexander Centennial" Residential Multi-Family (Small) District.

## DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- The proposed development involves conversion of the existing building in order to establish a Neighbourhood Rehabilitation Home and Multi-Family Dwelling use (18- units). The subject proposal was applied for and approved under DCU 21-251316/C and DAV 21-251319/C, however approvals have since lapsed. The current applications are required to proceed with the proposal.
- Neighbours were previously notified of the development via a community-wide mailer and public Open House and were in support of the initial proposal. The applicant states that support has been reaffirmed as part of this application
- The residential component of the project is proposed with the intent of providing affordable housing options for those with families in recovery or needing aftercare, as well as providing assisted living accommodations for those in recovery needing increased support.
- The proposed drawings show the existing parking lot would be developed with landscaping, green areas, adding a bicycle rack and other site amenities such as steel picket fencing and new lighting.
- In addition to previous upgrades to the existing building, including providing an automatic fire suppression system to the entire building, the applicant is proposing a new main entrance area facing Juno Street that would provide emergency services access.

- The applicant has submitted an arborist report confirming the location and condition of several mature trees near the Juno Street portion of the property. The Urban Planning & Design Division has encouraged preservation of the trees deemed viable by the arborist report. Trees being maintained have been included in the site plan landscape details.
- In addition to the proposed Conditional Use application, which is to permit the establishment of the proposed Neighbourhood Rehabilitation Home use, the applicant has also submitted a Variance application (DAV 24-278893\C) to accommodate aspects of the proposed Multi-Family Dwelling use. Please see the related Planner's report for analysis on the proposed Variances.

### **Background Information:**

- The Owner of the property, Adult & Teen Challenge Central Canada, are an organization that provides rehabilitation services and related housing supports to people struggling with addiction.
- The organization intends to utilize the existing building at 83 Kate Street in order to provide a full spectrum model that will support addiction recovery from beginning to end, from physical detox to short term and long-term treatment and rehabilitation, through all stages of recovery to independent living.
- The Owner intends to develop and utilize this property to serve its objective by providing residential services that support individuals by providing holistic services to those battling addictions, allowing individuals and families to receive the help they need in one single facility. This includes the aforementioned proposed Neighbourhood Rehabilitation Home, accessory Social Services Facility, and Multi-Family use.
- In addition to the proposed Neighbourhood Rehabilitation Home and accessory Social Services Facility, a residential component is proposed with the intent of providing affordable housing options for those with families in recovery or needing aftercare, as well as providing assisted living accommodations for those in recovery needing increased support.
- The proposed facility would provide a secure, safe and supportive community-based option for recovery and family support. It would also improve and provide community resources for addiction support for Winnipeg and Manitoba.

### **COLLABORATION**

- The applicant consulted with the Public Service to confirm support prior to submitting the subject application.

### **ANALYSIS AND ISSUES**

#### **COMPLETE COMMUNITIES DIRECTION STRATEGY 2.0**

The property is designated Established Neighbourhood – Mature Community under the *Complete Communities Direction Strategy 2.0 (CCDS 2.0)*. Policies applicable to the proposed development are included below.

***2.0 Design new development in Established Neighbourhoods to a high standard of urban design and construction to ensure new development adds value to public and private urban spaces to create a sense of place and civic pride.***

### *Building Setbacks*

2.2 *Encourage the location of commercial or mixed-use buildings at or near the front and corner side property lines to create a pedestrian orientation. Use setbacks to reinforce the public realm through landscaping and pedestrian amenities, such as entryways, patios, benches, and bicycle parking.*

### *Building design*

2.4 *Encourage the use of high-quality, energy efficient, and durable exterior building façade materials.*

2.5 *Encourage a variety of architectural styles.*

2.6 *Encourage building design to include a range of architectural features that create visual interest and positively contribute to the visual aesthetics of the street and neighbourhood.*

### *Pedestrian Orientation*

2.8 *Buildings with commercial uses should be designed to support pedestrian activity by providing building elements that increase visual interest which may include, but are not limited to, the following:*

- a. Direct pedestrian access to main building entrances from the street;*
- b. Transparent storefront displays;*
- c. Human scaled signage; and*
- d. Decorative lighting, awnings, benches and other pedestrian oriented amenities.*

### *Massing and scale*

1.12 *New development should respect and complement the existing character of the built form of surrounding properties.*

1.13 *Where appropriate, taller buildings should use step backs and roof design to mitigate negative impacts on adjacent properties and provide a more comfortable pedestrian environment.*

1.14 *Avoid buildings that create long blank walls facing public streets.*

1.15 *Encourage the use of architectural features to articulate building walls in order to mitigate the impact of new building mass*

## **5.0 Ensure Established Neighbourhoods accommodate a variety of public and institutional uses to meet a broad range of community needs.**

### *General policies*

5.1 *Support public and institutional uses where residential neighbourhoods are not well served by these amenities or are areas of higher need. These uses may include day cares, places of worship, elementary schools, libraries, community centres, public parks, and recreation facilities.*

## **WEST ALEXANDER AND CENTENNIAL NEIGHBOURHOOD SECONDARY PLAN**

- The subject site is in the “Medium Density Residential” policy area of the *West Alexander & Centennial Neighbourhood Secondary Plan (WACSP)* and is zoned under the West Alexander Centennial PDO-1.

- The general intent of the Residential policies under the Secondary Plan is stated as follows:  
*To foster a high-quality living environment and to preserve the strong sense of community while offering a wider variety of attractive and affordable housing choices which meet the changing needs of the West Alexander & Centennial community. In addition, the intent is to encourage more housing in locations with convenient access to employment opportunities and a broad range of community and commercial facilities.*
- Key relevant policies under the Secondary Plan include the following:
  - Accommodate a mix of residential housing including single-family, duplexes, and low/medium density multiple-family development.
  - Encourage the adaptive reuse of old industrial and commercial buildings for offices, artisans, or other compatible uses.
  - A density of one dwelling unit per 1,000 to 1,250 square feet of lot area may be accommodated through a discretionary review process.
- The “Transportation” section of the Secondary Plan contains additional policies that are relevant to accessory parking areas. The intent of the Plan is to create a safe and accessible environment for pedestrians; maintain efficient vehicular movement including public transit; and create parking that is well integrated in the neighbourhood. Key relevant policies include the following:
  - Require the design of parking structures and areas to be well-integrated with the neighbourhood, as well as the building(s) they serve.
  - Encourage parking structures and parking areas to be developed to a high standard of site design and enhancement.
  - Encourage proper edge treatments for parking areas that include the use of landscaping, as well as a fence or building wall. Materials should be compatible with the neighbouring buildings.

#### CITY OF WINNIPEG ZONING BY-LAW 200/2006

- In the Winnipeg Zoning By-law, a Neighbourhood Rehabilitation Home use and a Social Service Facility accessory use are Conditional in the “RMF” zoning district. For this reason, a Conditional Use application is required.

#### ANALYSIS OF CONDITIONAL USE

- Certain uses in the Zoning By-law 200/06 are deemed Conditional as they may or may not be appropriate for the particular context considered. As such, Conditional Uses require a higher level of planning review and analysis to determine suitability.
- After review, the Urban Planning & Design Division considers the proposed Conditional Use to be consistent with the *West Alexander & Centennial Neighbourhood Secondary Plan* and compatible with the surrounding neighbourhood.
- The proposal supports establishment of a mix of residential uses with wrap around supports for residents, including the proposed Neighbourhood Rehabilitation Home and the accessory Social Service Facility use, in a manner that results in adaptive reuse of an old industrial building.

- The proposal is to utilize an existing building, which in addition to preventing waste from going to the landfill also results in preservation of the existing built form and character of the neighbourhood.
- The proposed development would be compatible with surrounding land uses. For example, the new Ronald McDonald House Assisted Living Facility is across the street from the subject property, at the corner of McDermot Avenue and Juno Street. The site abuts a place of worship to the south-east. Bike lanes, sidewalks and transit link the property to the Health Sciences Centre (west) and the Downtown Exchange District (east).

## CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- A minimum south corner side yard setback of 20 feet is proposed for that portion of the property that abuts McDermot Avenue. Given the property is zoned “RMF-S” Residential Multi-Family (Small), the corner side yards setback requirement under the Winnipeg Zoning By-law is only 5 feet for residential structures but is 20 feet for non-residential uses. This clause would result in the non-residential structure setback requirement being applicable, which is appropriate given the project involves establishing a mix of uses within a former industrial building.

## REASONS FOR DECISION

In the context of Section 247(3), the Urban Planning and Design Division **approves** the application for the following reasons:

- (a) is consistent with *Plan Winnipeg* and any applicable secondary plan;  
*In that the proposed development adds a type of residential accommodation to the area in a manner that results in adaptive reuse of an existing old industrial building with a compatible land use.*
- (b) does not create a substantial adverse effect on the amenities, use, safety and convenience of the adjoining property and adjacent area, including an area separated from the property by a street or waterway;  
*In that the proposal involves maintaining and improving an existing property and is unlikely to pose a substantial adverse effect on the area.*
- (d) is compatible with the area in which the property to be affected is situated.  
*In that the proposed use is compatible with other uses in close proximity to the subject property.*

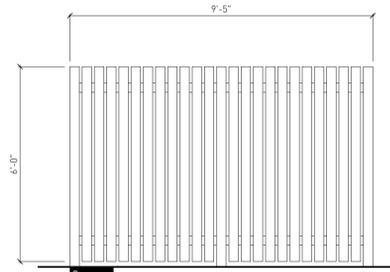
2 ELEVATIONS

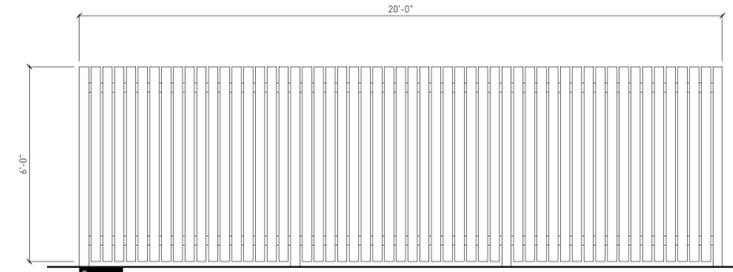
3 AXONOMETRIC VIEW
