Whilst in hospital at Basingstoke in England, I learnt embroidery and made this badge for which my wife's uncle made the frame. I have kept this badge of the regiment ever since.

As I am now 74, I would like to present it to the City in memory of this regiment which became famous in France during that horrible war. I have attached my cap badge and greatcoat buttons which I wore in France.

I enclose a photograph of myself taken in 1917 in my hospital clothes.
