



# Urban Agriculture & Community Gardens Small Grants Application Form

The Winnipeg Food Council is offering small grants to support community gardens and urban agriculture initiatives for projects delivered in 2025.

The Winnipeg Food Council is a citizen advisory committee of the City of Winnipeg, established by City Council in 2018. It is mandated to advise Mayor and Council on food policy through research and community consultation, and support the work of the community on food related issues.

**Applications are now being accepted for up to \$2,000 for new projects, garden renovations or operating costs.**

Organizations or equity-seeking groups, including Black, Indigenous, or Person of Colour (BIPOC) are encouraged to apply.

## **Criteria**

Priority will be given to projects which better support the objectives of the Winnipeg Food Council. You can improve the chances of acceptance for your project by highlighting how your project:

- Serves and/or is led by equity-seeking populations
- Is located in an area of higher need, food desert, or other area lacking community-based food assets
- Increases the amount of food grown in Winnipeg

We strongly encourage organizations that have not received the grant previously to apply as well.

You can demonstrate project need via support of local residents, participants, or agencies through various means including letters of support.

**Reporting:** All projects will be expected to provide a short final report of activities in the Fall of 2025. Reporting expectations, including deadlines, will be clearly outlined at time of acceptance.
