

2021 COMMUNITY CONSULTATIONS

This report is a summary of how the Winnipeg Police Board (Board) received and collected community input in 2021. The Board considers the comments from community members to inform the strategic priorities for the Winnipeg Police Service.

The Board is committed to ensure the strategic plan reflects the needs and values of citizens and offers opportunities to share input and concerns with the Board through public consultations, presentations, website surveys and written submissions.

The Board is open to public engagement activities to share the mandate of the Board and welcomes invitations to meet with community groups

During 2021, public health orders limiting indoor group capacity, physical distancing, mask wearing and proof of vaccination all provided barriers to holding in-person community consultations. Information gathering to inform the latest update to the strategic plan was limited to virtual meetings and web surveys. The Board members reached out to organizations within their networks to gage interest in meeting with the Board or receiving a presentation from the Board.
