Turn to 1 st person:

Declaration of Intent and Vows
Please face each other to repeat your vows.
Turn to 1 st person:
Please repeat after me. "I call upon these persons here present /to witness that I,, /do take you,, /to be my lawful wedded (husband, wife, spouse, partner)."
Turn to 2 nd person:
Please repeat after me. "I call upon these persons here present /to witness that I,, /do take you,, /to be my lawful wedded (husband, wife, spouse, partner)."
Exchange of Rings
These rings are a symbol of your marriage and a symbol of your love and of your life together. Turn to 1^{st} person:
Please place the ring on the 3 rd finger of's left hand and repeat after me. "With this ring, I thee wed /I shall love, honour and cherish thee, /and this ring is the symbol of my love." Turn to 2 nd person:
Please place the ring on the 3 rd finger of's left hand and repeat after me. "With this ring, I thee wed. /I shall love, honour and cherish thee, /and this ring is the symbol of my love."
<u>Signing of the Register</u>
At this time, the wedded parties and their witnesses will sign the Official Marriage Registration.
<u>Pronouncement</u>
I,(Marriage Officiant's name), by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Marriage Act, and the Province of
Manitoba, do hereby pronounce you, and, to be married.
I wish you a long life, filled with happiness and prosperity, and may the vows you made to each other today, sustain you forever. You may celebrate your marriage with a kiss.
