INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT ON FORM 4, CANDIDATE'S AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENT

To Larry McIntosh, Official Agent for Kevin Klein, the Candidate

Report on the Audit of Form 4 Candidate's Audited Financial Statement

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement, which comprise the Summary and Statement of Income and Expenses and supporting schedules for the candidacy of Kevin Klein for the campaign period from May 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023 relating to the election held on October 26, 2022 for Mayor of the City of Winnipeg.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the accompanying Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement, for Kevin Klein for the campaign period from May 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023 in the election are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the accounting requirements of The City of Winnipeg Campaign Expenses and Contributions By-law No. 10/2010 of *The City of Winnipeg Charter*.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Due to the nature of the types of transactions inherent in any election campaign, the completeness of contributions, fundraising and other income, expenses and donations in kind income and expenses is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these amounts was limited to the amounts recorded in the Candidate's election campaign accounting records and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to income, expenses and the candidacy period surplus/deficit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement* section of our report. We are independent of the Candidate in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement, in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting and Restriction on Use

We draw attention to the basis of accounting used in the preparation of the Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement. The Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement is prepared in accordance with the accounting requirements of The City of Winnipeg Campaign Expenses and Contributions By-law No. 10/2010 of *The City of Winnipeg Charter* providing for the regulation of expenses and contributions for candidates for Mayor and Councilors. The Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement is prepared solely for the information and use of the Campaign Expenses and Contributions Officer for the City of Winnipeg for complying with the By-law No. 10/2010 of *The City of Winnipeg Charter*. The Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than the specified users or for any other purpose. As a result, the Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged With Governance for Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement

The Official Agent and Candidate are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the Form 4, Audited Financial Statement in accordance with the accounting requirements of By-law No 10/2010 of *The City of Winnipeg Chart*er and for such internal control they consider necessary to enable the preparation of the Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement, as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of this Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement.

As part of an audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures
 that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the
 effectiveness of the Candidate's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates, if any, and related disclosures made by the Official Agent and the Candidate.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement, including any disclosures, and whether the Form 4, Candidate's Audited Financial Statement represents the underlying transactions and events in manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
