PART D - SUPPLEMENTAL CONDITIONS

GENERAL

D1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- D1.1 In addition to the *General Conditions for Provision of Services*, these Supplemental Conditions are applicable to the Work of the Contract.
- D1.2 The General Conditions are amended by striking out "The City of Winnipeg Act" wherever it appears in the General Conditions and substituting "The City of Winnipeg Charter".
- D1.3 The General Conditions are amended by striking out "Board of Commissioners" or "Commissioner" wherever it appears in the General Conditions and substituting the "Chief Administrative Officer".
- D1.4 The General Conditions are amended by striking out "Tender Package" wherever it appears in the General Conditions and substituting "Bid Opportunity".
- D1.5 The General Conditions are amended by striking out "Tender Submission" wherever it appears in the General Conditions and substituting "Bid Submission".
- D1.6 The General Conditions are amended by striking out "Bidding Instructions" wherever it appears in the General Conditions and substituting "Bidding Procedures".

D2. SCOPE OF WORK

- D2.1 The Work to be done under the Contract shall consist of mechanical container collection and disposal of community solid wastes, as envisioned by Clause 7(a)iii of the Solid Waste By-law for all premises within the East Sector of the City of Winnipeg entitled therein for the period of February 1, 2005 to January 31, 2011.
- D2.2 The major components of the Work are as follows:
 - (a) Provision of regular garbage collection services to apartment and small commercial premises that utilize authorized metal containers suitable for front-loading overhead, or rolloff garbage collection vehicles. The frequency of collection is to be bi-weekly, once or twice per week on a site-specific basis as directed
 - (b) As commercial premises now pay for the garbage collection service, a provision to unlock garbage bins so as to empty the contents may also be required. This is an extra cost service on an as-requested basis by the commercial customer. The Contractor will provide a padlock and key to each location requesting the service with the customer responsible for maintenance and security of the lock and key

D3. DURATION OF CONTRACT

D3.1 Notwithstanding GC.8.01, the Contractor shall perform the Work of this Contract during the period of February 1, 2005 to January 31, 2011.

D4.2 At the pre-commencement meeting, the Contract Administrator will identify additional personnel representing the Contract Administrator and their respective roles and responsibilities for the Work.

D5. CONTRACTOR'S SUPERVISOR

D5.1 At the pre-commencement meeting, the Contractor shall identify his designated supervisor and any additional personnel representing the Contractor and their respective roles and responsibilities for the Work.

D6. NOTICES

- D6.1 GC.7.06 is hereby amended to delete reference to "registered mail" and to replace same with "ordinary mail".
- D6.2 GC.7.06 is further amended hereby to include delivery by facsimile transmission (fax) as an acceptable means of delivering notices, consents, approvals, statements, authorizations, documents or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Contract. Deliveries by fax will be deemed to have been received on the day of delivery, if a business day, or if not a business day, on the business day next following the day of delivery.
- D6.3 Further to GC.7.06, all notices, consents, approvals, statements, authorizations, documents or other communications to the City, except as expressly otherwise required in D6.4, D6.5 or elsewhere in the Contract, shall be sent to the attention of the Contract Administrator at the address or facsimile number identified in D4.1.
- D6.4 All notices of appeal to the Chief Administrative Officer shall be sent to the attention of the Chief Financial Officer at the following address or facsimile number:

SUBMISSIONS

D7. AUTHORITY TO CARRY ON BUSINESS

D7.1 The Contractor shall be in good standing under The Corporations Act (Manitoba), or properly registered under The Business Names Registration Act (Manitoba), or otherwise properly registered, licensed or permitted by law to carry on business in Manitoba, or if the Contractor does not carry on business in Manitoba, in the jurisdiction where the Contractor does carry on business, throughout the term of the Contract, and shall provide the Contract Administrator with evidence thereof upon request.

D8. WORKERS COMPENSATION

D8.1 The Contractor shall be registered with the Workers Compensation Board of Manitoba, shall provide and maintain Workers Compensation coverage throughout the term of the Contract, and shall provide the Contract Administrator with evidence thereof upon request.

D9. PERFORMANCE SECURITY

- D9.1 The Contractor shall provide and maintain performance security until one (1) month after the total performance of the Contract in the form of:
 - (a) Performance Bonds of a company registered to conduct the business of a surety in Manitoba in the forms attached to these Supplemental Conditions (Form H1: Performance Bonds); the first ("Initial Performance Security") for three years in the amount of fifty percent (50%) of the Total Annual Contract Price, and subsequent performance bond(s) ("Renewal Performance Security"). Each such Renewal Performance Security shall be no less than one (1) year in duration and in the amount of fifty percent (50%) of the Total Annual Contract Price; or
 - (b) an irrevocable Standby Letter of Credit issued by a bank or other financial institution registered to conduct business in Manitoba, in the form attached to these Supplemental Conditions (Form H2: Irrevocable Standby Letter of Credit), in the amount of fifty percent (50%) of the Total Annual Contract Price; or
 - (c) a certified cheque or draft payable to "The City of Winnipeg", drawn on a bank or other financial institution registered to conduct business in Manitoba, in the amount of fifty percent (50%) of the Total <u>Annual</u> Contract Price
- D9.2 If the bid security provided in his Bid Submission was not a certified cheque or draft pursuant to B10.1(c), the Contractor shall provide the City Solicitor with the required performance security within seven (7) Calendar Days of notification of the award of the Contract by way of letter of intent and prior to the commencement of any Work on the Site but in no event later than the date specified in GC.3.01 for the return of the executed Contract.

Renewal of Performance Security

D9.3 Further to D9.1(a), the Renewal Performance Security shall be provided to the City no later than sixty (60) calendar days prior to the expiry of the Current Performance Security.

D10. INSURANCE

- D10.1 The Contractor shall provide and maintain the following insurance coverage:
 - (a) commercial general liability insurance, in the amount of at least five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00) all inclusive, with The City of Winnipeg being added as an additional insured, with a cross-liability clause, such liability policy to also contain a contractual liability, an unlicensed motor vehicle liability and a products and completed operations

- endorsement to remain in place at all times during the performance of the Work and throughout the warranty period:
- (b) automobile liability insurance for owned and non-owned automobiles used for or in connection with the Work in the amount of at least five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00) at all times during the performance of the Work and until the date of Total Performance.
- D10.2 Deductibles shall be borne by the Contractor.
- D10.3 The Contractor shall provide the Contract Administrator with a certified true copy or a certificate of insurance of each policy at least two (2) Business Days prior to the commencement of any Work on the Site but in no event later than the date specified in GC.3.01 for the return of the executed Contract.
- D10.4 The Contractor shall not cancel, materially alter, or cause each policy to lapse without providing at least thirty (30) Calendar Days prior written notice to the Contract Administrator.

SCHEDULE OF WORK

D11. COMMENCEMENT

- D11.1 The Contractor shall not commence any Work until he is in receipt of a letter of intent from the Award Authority authorizing the commencement of the Work.
- D11.2 The Contractor shall not commence any Work on the Site until:
 - (a) the Contract Administrator has confirmed receipt and approval of:
 - evidence that the Contractor is in good standing under The Corporations Act (Manitoba), or properly registered under The Business Names Registration Act (Manitoba), or otherwise properly registered, licensed or permitted by law to carry on business in Manitoba;
 - (ii) evidence of the workers compensation coverage specified in D8;
 - (iii) the performance security specified in D9;
 - (iv) evidence of the insurance specified in D10;
 - (v) evidence of the routing lists as specified in E3.1;
 - (vi) the equipment list specified in E4.
 - (b) the Contractor has attended a meeting with the Contract Administrator, or the Contract Administrator has waived the requirement for a meeting.

CONTROL OF WORK

D12. PRIME CONTRACTOR – THE WORKPLACE SAFETY AND HEALTH ACT (MANITOBA)

D12.1 Further to GC.5.02, the Contractor shall be the Prime Contractor and shall serve as, and have the duties of the Prime Contractor in accordance with The Workplace Safety and Health Act (Manitoba).

MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

D13. INVOICES:

D13.1 Payments to the Contractor will be made following the end of each month based on a certificate prepared by the Contract Administrator, indicating each payment item in Form B: Prices that were fully and properly serviced in accordance with the Specifications during the referenced

monthly period. Month-end payments will be on the basis of one-twelfth (1/12) of the annual unit price Bid for each item collected fully, or added to the collection list during the previous month. No compensation will be applied for pick-up items deleted at any point during the previous month.

D13.2 The Contractor will be allowed a thirty (30) day period after any payment certificate is initiated by the Contract Administrator for objection to the quantities therein, with such statement of objection, in writing, to be accompanied by a location pickup list showing the Contractor's quantity considerations. The decision of the Contract Administrator will be final following a review of such objection.

D14. PAYMENT SCHEDULE

D14.1 Further to GC.9.03, payment shall be Canadian funds net fifteen (15) Calendar Days after the conclusion of the previous month's work.

D15. ANNUAL REVIEW – INFLATIONARY ADJUSTMENT:

- D15.1 The unit prices specified in Form B: Prices will be adjusted on February 1, 2006 and each year thereafter, based on the percentage increase or decrease in unit prices for the Contract year, February 1, 2005 to January 31, 2006 = 50% of percentage change in Index A, plus 15% of percentage change in Index B, plus 15% of percentage change in Index C.
- D15.2 Index A, B and C:
 - (a) Index "A"

Average hourly earnings - employees paid by the hour in "Manufacturing" in the Province of Manitoba (Statistics Canada Reference Table 281-0029)

(b) Index "B"

Industrial Product Price Index for motor vehicle industry (Statistics Canada Reference Table 329-0038)

(c) Index "C"

Operation of automotive vehicles component (private transportation) of the Consumer Price Index for Canada (Statistics Canada Reference Table 326-0001)

D15.3 The indices A, B and C will be those prepared by Statistics Canada. Since some of the indices are not available from Statistics Canada until some time after the adjustment date of February 1, the Contract Administrator will extrapolate the available data for each index to provide for an interim adjustment and will make final adjustments when the published index figures are available.

WARRANTY

D16. WARRANTY

- D16.1 Notwithstanding GC.10.01 and GC.10.02, the Contractor shall, at his sole cost and expense, maintain the Work against any and all claims or deficiencies or otherwise that may arise, for a period of one (1) month from the date of the Certificate of Total Performance.
- D16.2 At least two (2) weeks prior to the expiration of the Warranty Period, or upon correction of all outstanding deficiencies, whichever is later, the Contractor shall arrange, attend and assist in the acceptance of the Work. The Contract Administrator shall, on being satisfied that all outstanding deficiencies have been corrected, issue a Certificate of Acceptance for the Work to be dated not earlier than one (1) month after the date of Certificate of Total Performance or the

date that the Contractor corrects the final deficiencies, whichever is the later, thereby terminating the Warranty Period. The Certificate of Acceptance will, subject to Clause GC.10.02, indicate acceptance of the due performance of the Contract

Extension of Warranty Period

D16.3 Further to Clause GC.10.02 of the General Conditions, in the event that all outstanding deficiencies have not been corrected to the satisfaction of the Contract Administrator at least one (1) week prior to the expiration of the Warranty Period, the Contractor shall be required to provide and maintain, at his sole cost and expense, an extension of the Performance Bond for a further one (1) month term with regard to those items of work that have been identified as still being deficient. Failure to do so shall result in the City realizing on the Performance Security.
