PART B – BIDDING PROCEDURES

- Add: B17.5 The award of this Contract is contingent upon Council of the City of Winnipeg confirming the expropriation of and for the purpose of Public Street for the Kenaston Grade Separation Project (By-law No. 182/2004).
- Add: B17.6 As noted on Form B: Prices, the Work of this Bid Opportunity is categorized into 6 Parts, identified as Parts A through F. It is the intent of the City to award all Parts to the responsible and qualified Bidder submitting the lowest evaluated responsive total bid price. It will be a condition of the Contract that the award for Parts A, D, E and F will be an unconditional award requiring commencement as specified in D12 Commencement. However the award for all or portions of Parts B and C will be a conditional award contingent on the Government of Canada providing consent to enter and construct on its lands related to the Parts B and C Works and those Works are not to be commenced until the Contract Administrator advises the Contractor that Canada's consent to enter and construct has been obtained. If the Work of the Contract is reduced because the consent of Canada is not obtained, any such reduction shall not be considered in calculating the aggregate reduction in the Contract Price.
