PART A - BID SUBMISSION

Form B(R2): Revised Descriptions for Items 1a, 1b and 1c (approximate number of trees).

PART B – BIDDING PROCEDURES

Revise B3.2 to read:

- B3.2 The Bidder is advised to view the Sites so as to become aware of the sizes of the trees to be maintained.
 - (a) Tree size may directly affect how much water will be required during maintenance, **but in general the diameters of the trees to be maintained are between 5 and 10cm.**

Revise B3.4 to read:

B3.4 For the Bidder's convenience, a map displaying the approximate locations of the trees to be maintained is attached in E8. Please be advised that one dot may represent multiple trees at that particular location.

PART E - SPECIFICATIONS

Revise E2.2 to read:

- E2.2 A watering cycle shall be based on all of the **four hundred (400)** trees, and in accordance with the applicable specifications:
 - (a) The watering cycle shall be repeated per E2.4, E2.5, and E2.6.
 - (i) hard surface boulevards with having approximately three hundred (300) trees;
 - (ii) turf covered boulevards with having approximately ninety (90) trees;
 - (iii) red shale boulevards with having approximately ten (10) trees.
 - (b) The recognized watering and maintenance standard for the work required is approximately eight(8) to ten (10) times during the growing season (May to October).

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(c) The rule of thumb is forty (40) litres of water per twenty-five (25) mm calliper and all trees will be under twenty-five (25) cm diameter measured at one hundred and forty centimetres (140cm) above ground level.
