PART A - BID SUBMISSION

Replace: 277-2009 Bid Submission with 277-2009 Addendum 1 - Bid Submission. The following is a summary of

changes incorporated in the replacement Bid Submission:

Form B(R1): Replace entire form.

PART E - SPECIFICATIONS

Revise: E2.2 to read: All trees will have a tree protective zone (TPZ) at the dripline of the crown, which will

remain free of digging, trenching, grade changes, stock piling of materials and soil compaction, throughout the duration of the Contract. Protective snow fencing around these areas is required. The TPZ shall be considered to be the ground surface directly

beneath the tips of its outermost branches.

Revise: E2.4 to read: Excavation shall be performed in a manner that minimizes damage to the existing root

systems. Where possible, excavation shall be carried out such that the edge of the excavation shall be a minimum of 3m from the closest edge of the trunk. Where roots must be cut to facilitate excavation, they shall be pruned neatly at the face of excavation by an arborist licensed to practice in the Province of Manitoba. They must be properly trimmed with sharp tools to prevent crushing or being pulled up by construction

equipment. No paint is required. All exposed roots must be mulched until the excavated

area is filled with clean earth to avoid exposure to sunlight and desiccation.

Revise: E2.5 to read: No operation of equipment will occur within the TPZ unless authorized by the City

Forester or designate. Equipment shall not be parked, repaired, refuelled; construction materials shall not be stored, and earth materials shall not be stockpiled within the TPZ. The Contractor shall ensure that the operations do not cause flooding or sediment

deposition on areas where trees are located.

Revise: E2.9 to read: Auguring under existing trees will be the only acceptable method of underground

installations. Any other excavations must be approved by the Urban Forestry Branch.
