PART E - SPECIFICATIONS

GENERAL

E1. GENERAL

E1.1 These Specifications shall apply to the Work.

E2. GOODS

E2.1 The Contractor shall supply and deliver a propane powered forklift in accordance with the requirements hereinafter specified.

E3. WARRANTY

- E3.1 The Contractor warrants that the goods will be free of any and all defects or deficiencies for a period of three (3) years or 6000 hours, no deductible, from the date the equipment is put into service by the City of Winnipeg.
- E3.2 Upon notification by the Contract Administrator, the Contractor shall, at his/her sole cost and expense, remedy any defect or deficiency within a period of two (2) Business days as identified by the Contract Administrator during the warranty period and any damage that may arise or result from the defect or deficiency or as a result of the correction of same.

E4. TRAINING

- E4.1 The Supplier shall provide at their expense, up to four (4) hours of operational and maintenance training by qualified staff for the City of Winnipeg Operational and Maintenance Personnel. The training shall be conducted in a separate or combined session/s for each group of personnel. The session/s shall be sufficient in duration and shall provide adequate familiarization and orientation on the vehicle, to the satisfaction of the Contract Administrator.
- E4.2 The training shall be conducted in Winnipeg at a location to be designated by the Contract Administrator.

E5. REPEATED FAILURES

- E5.1 The term "repeated failures" three (3) times will be determined by the Contract Administrator, and used herein is defined to mean that the same component, subassembly, or assembly develops repeated defects, breakdowns and/or malfunctions rendering the apparatus inoperative, or requiring repeated shop correction, service and/or replacement during the warranty period applicable for said component, subassembly, or assembly.
- E5.2 Minor items or ordinary service adjustments are not included, or considered under the scope of "repeated failures", as well as other factors, such as operational damage due to accidents, misuse or lack of proper maintenance, service and lubrication attention by not following the manufacturer's preventative maintenance schedule.
- Where the apparatus develops "repeated failures" in service, the Contractor shall make any necessary engineering changes, repairs, alterations or modifications in order to guarantee reliability of performance, at no cost to the City of Winnipeg, including all incidental costs, with a reapplied, full warranty.

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E6. PRENTATIVE MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

- E6.1 The Contractor shall provide full details of the Preventative Maintenance (PM) Program specific to the equipment being offered and shall include part numbers on regular maintenance items, filters, oils, belts etc.. The Preventative Maintenance Program shall be submitted within ten (10) working days from the date of notification of award of Contract.

E6.3 If the PM Program has not been submitted by the Contractor to the City within ten (10) working days from the date of notification of award of Contract, the City will perform the work and acquire the information at its own expense. The costs incurred (up to and including \$500.00) will be deducted from the Contractor's final invoice.
