SUPPLEMENTAL CONDITIONS

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GENERAL

D1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- D1.1 In addition to the *General Conditions for Construction Contracts*, these Supplemental Conditions are applicable to the Work of the Contract.
- D1.2 The General Conditions are amended by striking out "The City of Winnipeg Act" wherever it appears in the General Conditions and substituting "The City of Winnipeg Charter".
- D1.3 The General Conditions are amended by striking out "Tender Package" wherever it appears in the General Conditions and substituting "Bid Opportunity".
- D1.4 The General Conditions are amended by striking out "Tender Submission" wherever it appears in the General Conditions and substituting "Bid Submission".
- D1.5 The General Conditions are amended by deleting GC:6.16 and GC:6.17. The City of Winnipeg is now within the jurisdiction of the Manitoba Ombudsman pursuant to The Ombudsman Act.

D2. SCOPE OF WORK

- D2.1 The Work to be done under the Contract shall consist of the construction cast-in-place and pre-cast concrete gate chambers for flood control purposes at various locations in the City of Winnipeg.
- D2.2 The major components of the Work are as follows:
- (a) Construction of cast-in-place concrete gate chamber on the Bishop Grandin Land Drainage Sewer outfall pipe including supply and installation of cast iron sluice and flap gates.
 - (b) Construction of a cast-in-place concrete gate chamber addition to the existing concrete gate chamber on the Rice Road Land Drainage Sewer outfall pipe including supply and installation of cast iron sluice and flap gates.
 - (c) Installation of an 1800 millimetre diameter manhole and approximately 5.0 metres of 600 millimetre diameter concrete land drainage sewer by trenchless methods on Rice Road.
 - (d) Construction of a pre-cast concrete gate chamber on the Stormont Drive Land Drainage Sewer outfall pipe including supply and installation of cast iron gate valve and flap gate.

- D3.2 At the pre-construction meeting, the Contract Administrator will identify additional personnel representing the Contract Administrator and their respective roles and responsibilities for the Work.

D4. CONTRACTOR'S SUPERVISOR

- D4.1 At the pre-construction meeting, the Contractor shall identify his designated supervisor and any additional personnel representing the Contractor and their respective roles and responsibilities for the Work.

D5. NOTICES

- D5.1 Except as provided for in GC:23.2.2, all notices, requests, nominations, proposals, consents, approvals, statements, authorizations, documents or other communications to the Contractor shall be sent to the address or facsimile number identified by the Contractor in Paragraph 2 of Form A: Bid.
- D5.2 All notices, requests, nominations, proposals, consents, approvals, statements, authorizations, documents or other communications to the City, except as expressly otherwise required in D5.3, D5.4 or elsewhere in the Contract, shall be sent to the attention of the Contract Administrator at the address or facsimile number identified in D3.1.

D6. FURNISHING OF DOCUMENTS

- D6.1 Upon award of the Contract, the Contractor will be provided with five (5) complete sets of the Bid Opportunity. If the Contractor requires additional sets of the Bid Opportunity, they will be supplied to him at cost.

SUBMISSIONS

D7. PERFORMANCE SECURITY

- D7.1 The Contractor shall provide and maintain performance security until the expiration of the warranty period in the form of:
- (a) a performance bond of a company registered to conduct the business of a surety in Manitoba, in the form attached to these Supplemental Conditions (Form H1: Performance Bond), in the amount of fifty percent (50%) of the Contract Price; or

- (b) an irrevocable standby letter of credit issued by a bank or other financial institution registered to conduct business in Manitoba and drawn on a branch located in Manitoba, in the form attached to these Supplemental Conditions (Form H2: Irrevocable Standby Letter of Credit), in the amount of fifty percent (50%) of the Contract Price; or
- (c) a certified cheque or draft payable to "The City of Winnipeg", drawn on a bank or other financial institution registered to conduct business in Manitoba, in the amount of fifty percent (50%) of the Contract Price.

D7.2 If the bid security provided in his Bid Submission was not a certified cheque or draft pursuant to B10.1(c), the Contractor shall provide the City Solicitor with the required performance security within seven (7) Calendar Days of notification of the award of the Contract by way of letter of intent and prior to the commencement of any Work on the Site but in no event later than the date specified in GC:4.1 for the return of the executed Contract.

D8. INSURANCE

D8.1 The Contractor shall provide and maintain the following insurance coverage:

- (a) commercial general liability insurance, in the amount of at least two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) all inclusive, with The City of Winnipeg being added as an additional insured, with a cross-liability clause, such liability policy to also contain a contractual liability, an unlicensed motor vehicle liability and a products and completed operations endorsement to remain in place at all times during the performance of the Work and throughout the warranty period;
- (b) automobile liability insurance for owned and non-owned automobiles used for or in connection with the Work in the amount of at least two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) at all times during the performance of the Work and until the date of Total Performance;
- (c) all risks course of construction insurance in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the total Contract Price, written in the name of the Contractor and The City of Winnipeg, at all times during the performance of the Work and until the date of Total Performance.

D8.2 Deductibles shall be borne by the Contractor.

D8.3 The Contractor shall provide the City Solicitor with a certified true copy or a certificate of insurance of each policy, in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor, at least two (2) Business Days prior to the commencement of any Work on the Site but in no event later than the date specified in GC:4.1 for the return of the executed Contract.

D9. DETAILED PRICES

D9.1 The Contractor shall provide the Contract Administrator with a detailed price breakdown (Form I: Detailed Prices) at least five (5) Business Days prior to the commencement of any Work on the Site but in no event later than the date specified in the General Conditions for the return of the executed Contract.

D9.2 The Contractor shall state a price for each item or sub-item of the Work identified on Form I: Detailed Prices. The total of the detailed prices must be consistent with the price(s) provided in the Contractor's Bid.

D10. DETAILED WORK SCHEDULE

D10.1 The Contractor shall provide the Contract Administrator with a detailed work schedule at least two (2) Business Days prior to the commencement of any Work on the Site but in no event later than the date specified in the General Conditions for the return of the executed Contract.

- D10.2 The detailed work schedule shall consist of the following:
- (a) a critical path method (C.P.M.) schedule for the Work;
 - (b) a Gantt chart for the Work based on the C.P.M. schedule; and all acceptable to the Contract Administrator.
- D10.3 Further to D10.2 a), the CPM schedule shall clearly identify the start and completion dates of all the following activities/tasks making up the Work as well as showing those activities/tasks on the critical path for each Gate Chamber:
- (a) Flap gates, sluice gates and gate valves
 - (i) submit shop drawings;
 - (ii) delivery;
 - (iii) installationshow separate tasks for wall thimbles, flap gate, and sluice gate, if different dates apply.
 - (b) Gate chamber excavation and shoring:
 - (i) Mobilization.
 - (ii) submit construction method submission;
 - (iii) submit shoring shop drawings;
 - (iv) dewatering (if required);
 - (v) excavation and shoring.
 - (c) Gate chamber construction
 - (i) submit required shop drawings;
 - (ii) construct hoarding;
 - (iii) construct floor;
 - (iv) install wall thimbles;
 - (v) construct walls (indicate each separate pour)*;
 - (vi) construct roof;
 - (vii) remove shoring and backfill;
 - (viii) install miscellaneous metals;
 - (ix) install gates (show separate tasks for wall thimbles, flap gate, and sluice gate, if different dates apply.);
 - (x) test gates;
 - (xi) surface restoration and landscaping.
- D10.4 Further to D10.2(b), the Gantt chart shall show the time on a weekly basis, required to carry out the Work activity. The time shall be on the horizontal axis, and the activity shall be on the vertical axis.

SCHEDULE OF WORK

D11. COMMENCEMENT

- D11.1 The Contractor shall not commence any Work until he is in receipt of a letter of intent from the Award Authority authorizing the commencement of the Work.
- D11.2 The Contractor shall not commence any Work on the Site until:
- (a) the Contract Administrator has confirmed receipt and approval of:
 - (i) evidence that the Contractor is in good standing under The Corporations Act (Manitoba), or properly registered under The Business Names Registration Act

(Manitoba), or otherwise properly registered, licensed or permitted by law to carry on business in Manitoba;

- (ii) evidence of the workers compensation coverage specified in GC:6.14;
 - (iii) the performance security specified in D7;
 - (iv) evidence of the insurance specified in D8;
 - (v) the detailed prices specified D9
 - (vi) the detailed work schedule specified D10
- (b) the Contractor has attended a pre-construction meeting with the Contract Administrator, or the Contract Administrator has waived the requirement for a pre-construction meeting.

D12. SUBSTANTIAL PERFORMANCE

D12.1 The Contractor shall achieve Substantial Performance by March 15, 2005.

D12.2 When the Contractor considers the Work to be substantially performed, the Contractor shall arrange, attend and assist in the inspection of the Work with the Contract Administrator for purposes of verifying Substantial Performance. Any defects or deficiencies in the Work noted during that inspection shall be remedied by the Contractor at the earliest possible instance and the Contract Administrator notified so that the Work can be reinspected.

D12.3 The date on which the Work has been certified by the Contract Administrator as being substantially performed to the requirements of the Contract through the issue of a certificate of Substantial Performance is the date on which Substantial Performance has been achieved.

D13. TOTAL PERFORMANCE

D13.1 The Contractor shall achieve Total Performance by June 30, 2005.

D13.2 When the Contractor or the Contract Administrator considers the Work to be totally performed, the Contractor shall arrange, attend and assist in the inspection of the Work with the Contract Administrator for purposes of verifying Total Performance. Any defects or deficiencies in the Work noted during that inspection shall be remedied by the Contractor at the earliest possible instance and the Contract Administrator notified so that the Work can be reinspected.

D13.3 The date on which the Work has been certified by the Contract Administrator as being totally performed to the requirements of the Contract through the issue of a certificate of Total Performance is the date on which Total Performance has been achieved.

D14. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

D14.1 If the Contractor fails to achieve Substantial Performance or Total Performance in accordance with the Contract by the days fixed herein for same, the Contractor shall pay the City the following amounts per Calendar Day for each and every Calendar Day following the days fixed herein for same during which such failure continues:

- (a) Substantial Performance –Six hundred dollars (\$600.00);
- (b) Total Performance – Three Hundred dollars (\$300.00).

D14.2 The amount specified for liquidated damages in D14.1 is based on a genuine pre-estimate of the City's losses in the event that the Contractor does not achieve Substantial Performance by the day fixed herein for same.

D14.3 The City may reduce any payment to the Contractor by the amount of any liquidated damages assessed.

D15. SCHEDULED MAINTENANCE

D15.1 The Contractor shall perform the following scheduled maintenance in the manner and within the time periods required by the Specifications.;

(a) Landscape maintenance as specified in CW 3510.

D15.2 Determination of Substantial Performance and Total Performance shall be exclusive of scheduled maintenance identified herein. All scheduled maintenance shall be completed prior to the expiration of the warranty period. Where the scheduled maintenance cannot be completed during the warranty period, the warranty period shall be extended for such period of time as it takes the Contractor to complete the scheduled maintenance.

CONTROL OF WORK

D16. JOB MEETINGS

D16.1 Regular weekly job meetings will be held at the Site. These meetings shall be attended by a minimum of one representative of the Contract Administrator, one representative of the City and one representative of the Contractor. Each representative shall be a responsible person capable of expressing the position of the Contract Administrator, the City and the Contractor respectively on any matter discussed at the meeting including the Work schedule and the need to make any revisions to the Work schedule. The progress of the Work will be reviewed at each of these meetings.

D16.2 The Contract Administrator reserves the right to cancel any job meeting or call additional job meetings whenever he deems it necessary.

D17. PRIME CONTRACTOR – THE WORKPLACE SAFETY AND HEALTH ACT (MANITOBA)

D17.1 Further to GC:6.26, the Contractor shall be the Prime Contractor and shall serve as, and have the duties of the Prime Contractor in accordance with The Workplace Safety and Health Act (Manitoba).

D18. TRAFFIC CONTROL AND MAINTENANCE OF ACCESS

D18.1 Comply with the requirements of CW 1130 for traffic control and maintenance of access.

D18.2 Do not park construction vehicles in a manner that will block traffic on streets adjacent to the Site.

D18.3 Provide flag persons to direct traffic around construction vehicles that are unloading equipment and materials at the Site.

D18.4 Do not stockpile materials in a location and manner that will obstruct the safe operation of motor vehicles past the Site.

MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

D19. PAYMENT SCHEDULE

D19.1 Further to GC:12.1, payment for the supply and installation of all materials and other items incorporated into the completed work for Construction of Gate Chambers shall be in accordance with the following payment schedule:

- (a) Payment shall be pro rated against the Unit Bid Prices based on percentage completion of each of the items of work identified on Form B: Prices, including percentage completion of major items of work identified on Form I: Detailed Prices.

- (c) make all the payments whether to the Obligee or to others as therein provided;
- (d) in every other respect comply with the conditions and perform the covenants contained in the Contract; and
- (e) indemnify and save harmless the Obligee against and from all loss, costs, damages, claims, and demands of every description as set forth in the Contract, and from all penalties, assessments, claims, actions for loss, damages or compensation whether arising under "The Workers Compensation Act", or any other Act or otherwise arising out of or in any way connected with the performance or non-performance of the Contract or any part thereof during the term of the Contract and the warranty period provided for therein;

THEN THIS OBLIGATION SHALL BE VOID, but otherwise shall remain in full force and effect. The Surety shall not, however, be liable for a greater sum than the sum specified above.

AND IT IS HEREBY DECLARED AND AGREED that the Surety shall be liable as Principal, and that nothing of any kind or matter whatsoever that will not discharge the Principal shall operate as a discharge or release of liability of the Surety, any law or usage relating to the liability of Sureties to the contrary notwithstanding.
