1.0 DESCRIPTION OF EQUIPMENT AND PERFORMANCE

1.1 These specifications describe the supply and delivery of a minimum

PLATFORM PONTOON BOAT

with equipment and features as specified herein.

- 1.2 The platform pontoon boat and all other items/components shall be the manufacturer's latest model. The platform pontoon boat shall be furnished complete and ready for operation. Any parts or accessories not specifically mentioned, but which are required to complete and place the platform pontoon boat (including attachments) in successful operation shall be furnished as though specifically mentioned in these specifications. The complete platform pontoon boat and attachments, and all parts thereof, shall conform in strength and quality of material and workmanship, to the best standards and engineering practice of the industry.
- 1.3 Shall be capable of consistent top performance for boulevard, walkway and parkland maintenance, snow removal work and other miscellaneous functions during the summer and winter environment which is normal to the City of Winnipeg.

2.0 ELIGIBLE MODELS

2.1 State make and model of <u>platform pontoon boat</u> being bid.

3.0 OTHER SPECIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS

- 3.1 All applicable SAE standards form an integral part of these specifications and shall have precedence in any conflict concerning minimum acceptable standards.
- 3.2 The <u>platform pontoon boat and all its components</u> shall comply with all Federal Coast Guard regulations and requirements

4.0 SERVICE FACILITY

- 4.1 For the purpose of warranty repairs, the Bidder shall have an authorized service facility <u>located within 10 km of</u> <u>the boundaries of the City of Winnipeg.</u> The facility, or a portion thereof, shall be dedicated to the service and maintenance of the type equipment being offered. Further to **B9.1**, Bidders shall provide a description of the service facility including, but not limited to, number of qualified service staff, years of service experience, and general service capabilities within three (3) Business Days upon request of the Contract Administrator.
- 4.2 If a suitable warranty facility is not available within 10 km of the boundaries of the City of Winnipeg, the Bidder may propose that warranty work be performed by the City of Winnipeg Repair Facility. Any Work performed by the City of Winnipeg Repair Facility shall be charged to the Contractor at the Facility's shop rate in effect at the time the work is performed (for example, shop rate for 2006: \$73.50/hour).

4.3 Location of the service facility located within 10 km of the boundaries of the City of Winnipeg.

The Bidder shall choose and fill in one of the Clauses listed below. — 4.3.1 OR 4.3.2

4.3.1 Bidder's own facility location. State the location of the service facility below.

4.3.2 Bidder elects to have warranty work be performed by the City of Winnipeg Repair Facility.

 - 9.3.2 Siding thickness Minimum of 1/16 INCH. State thickness.

10.0 PLATFORM PONTOON BOAT EXTRAS:

- 10.1 Navigational Lights, two front, one rear.
- 10.2 Polyurethane Console.
- 10.3 Minimum of 24 gallon fuel tank capacity.
 - 10.3.1 State Capacity
- 10.4 Heavy duty anchor points in each corner.

11.0 <u>MOTOR</u>

- 11.1 Shall be provided and installed by The City of Winnipeg
 - 11.1.1 Transom constructed to accept a Mercury 135hp Optimax

12.0 TRAINING

12.1 The Contractor shall be required to provide training (at the Contractor's expense) for the City of Winnipeg maintenance and operating personnel. The training shall be divided into two separate sessions, one for maintenance personnel and one for operating personnel.

The duration of the sessions shall be as long as required for adequate familiarization and orientation of the equipment to the satisfaction of the Contract Administrator. The training shall be conducted in Winnipeg at a time and location designated by the Contract Administrator.

<u>Note:</u> Pricing should be based on one (1) working day for maintenance personnel and one (1) working day for operating personnel. The first payment of the contract on the equipment will not be issued until successful completion of training has been conducted to the satisfaction of the Contract Administrator.

13.0 PERFORMANCE RELIABILITY

- 13.1 The responsibility for the design of the complete equipment, it's performance and reliability shall rest upon the Contractor.
- 13.2 The term *"repeated failures"* as used herein is defined to mean that the same component, subassembly, or assembly develops repeated defects, breakdowns and/or malfunctions rendering the equipment inoperative, or requiring repeated shop correction, service and/or replacement during the warranty period applicable for said component, subassembly, or assembly.

Ordinary service adjustments are not included, or considered under the scope of "repeated failures", as well as other factors, such as operational damage due to accidents, misuse or lack of proper maintenance, service and lubrication attention by not following the manufacturer's preventative maintenance schedule.

13.3 Where the equipment develops "repeated failures" in service, the Contractor shall make any necessary engineering changes, repairs, alterations or modifications in order to guarantee reliability of performance.

14.0 WARRANTY

14.1 The warranty requirements shall be a minimum of <u>one (1)</u> year parts and labour inclusive, "bumper to bumper" on the complete **platform pontoon boat**.

<u>The warranty shall not include</u> regular maintenance or any item deemed as a consumable that is subject to everyday wear and tear, during the regular operation of the unit.

- 14.2 The Contractor shall warrant the <u>platform pontoon boat</u>, and all parts thereof, against any defects of workmanship, construction and materials, and agrees to repair or replace, without cost to the City, any article that has become defective and not proven to have been caused by negligence on the part of the user within <u>one (1) year</u>, from the date the equipment is put into service by the City of Winnipeg.
- 14.3 The Contractor shall warrant all attachments, and all parts thereof, against any defects of workmanship, construction and materials, and agrees to repair or replace, <u>without cost to the City</u>, any article that has become defective and not proven to have been caused by negligence on the part of the user within <u>one (1) year</u> from the date the equipment is put into service by the City of Winnipeg.
- 14.4 The Contractor's Winnipeg dealer/representative or service facility, shall make available all replacement parts <u>and</u> have completed all warranty repairs on the <u>platform pontoon boat</u> within <u>seven(7) business days.</u>

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15.0 ITEM – 1A – PLATFROM PONTOON BOAT


16.0 ITEM – 1B – OPERATOR'S MANUALS – for ITEM – 1A

17.0 ITEM – 1C — PARTS, REPAIR and TECHNICAL SERVICE MANUALS — for ITEM – 1A





REAR VIEW


