PART E – SPECIFICATIONS

Revise: E4.7 to read:

E4.7 The City requires the ability to **discontinue service of up to 750** cellular devices in any given year of the contract without penalty. **This is required to accommodate seasonal work, changes in staff or changes in work processes. If a device is removed from service, the City will endeavor to place that device back into service as soon as practical. Devices that have been in service less than 12 months will remain the property of the contractor and will be returned to the contractor unless returned to service within 9 months of the termination of service.**

Questions and Answers

Q1 Referencing E4.7. Does this mean the Contractor could upgrade all your devices and 2 months down the road you could disconnect all or half your devices and walk away with the handsets as well?

A1 Please see Addendum

Q2 Referencing E5.8, E5.13 and E5.18 – these sections indicate that the device “may” include PCMCIA or Express Card slots. Given that most manufacturers are no longer producing (and in some cases no longer supporting) this type of hardware, would the city accept a response to this area to include a USB Stick with a PCMCIA to USB adapters?

A2 As PCMCIA cards and similar devices are being discontinued, the City has amended the requirement to provide pricing for Items No. 71, 76, and 81. Please see Addendum.
