PART E – SPECIFICATIONS

Section 01 41 00 Regulatory Requirements

Revise: 2.2.2 Building Permit to read:

- .1 City of Winnipeg has applied for and paid for building permit. The Contractor is responsible for reimbursing the City of Winnipeg for the costs of the building permit and obtaining or coordinating other permits required for Work and its various parts.
 - .1 The costs for the building permit are \$112,524.92.
- .2 Contractor shall display building permit and other permits in a conspicuous location at Place of Work.

Section 06 40 00 Architectural Woodwork

Delete clauses 1.4.2 and 1.4.2.1.

Revise 2.1.1 to read:

Lumber, plywood, and composite wood products should be FSC certified, SCI certified, or purchased from Legal Sources and Responsible Sources as defined by ASTM D7612-10 wherever feasible. This certification is preferred but is not a mandatory requirement.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q1: The specification references FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) and SFI in Rough Carpentry (06 10 00) and Architectural Woodwork (06 40 00) spec sections. Due to minimum quantity/chain of custody requirements these certifications would not be available/feasible for this project. Please confirm FSC/SFI requirements will be deleted.

A1: FSC or SCI certified wood should still be purchased wherever feasible, but this is no longer a mandatory requirement for these sections. Refer to the specification revisions above.
