2. Tanks shall be purged of flammable vapours or inerting the potential explosive atmosphere in the tank.	<input type="checkbox"/>
3. All associated piping shall be removed.	<input type="checkbox"/>

6. The contractor must notify the Fire Prevention Branch (204-986-8200) for a site inspection, a minimum of three business days in advance when tanks are removed.	<input type="checkbox"/>
