CITY OF WINNIPEG CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

TO: Resident/Business Owners near Smith Street between Portage Avenue and Notre Dame Avenue RE: Downtown Pavement Renewals Project – 2023 Construction

Traffic implications: Long-term lane closures on Smith Street

Dear Downtown stakeholder,

The third phase of the Downtown Pavement Renewals Project is scheduled to begin May 23, 2023.

 Work will take place on Smith Street from Portage Avenue to Notre Dame Avenue from mid-May to July 2023

Work will include:

- Traffic signals installations
- Sewer-related underground work
- Pavement removal and replacement
- New sidewalk construction
- Reconfiguring of intersections at Notre Dame Avenue & King Street/Smith Street and Notre Dame Avenue & Smith Street & Donald Street/Princess Street
 - See attached drawing for additional information on these changes.
- Curb bump outs will be added on the west side of Smith Street just north of Ellice Avenue and both sides of King Street just north of Notre Dame Avenue to improve pedestrian crossing safety and traffic flow
 - o The bumpout at the northeast corner of Smith Street and Notre Dame Avenue will be the location of a new Transit stop and the Loading Zone will be removed.

Traffic impacts during construction:

- One lane of traffic will be maintained throughout
 - o Various rolling lane closures will be required.
 - o Construction will be completed half of the road at a time
- All parking and loading zones will be removed
- Pedestrian access and Transit service will be maintained throughout construction
 - o Temporary bus stop relocations or closures may be required at various times.

- Details and instructions regarding construction and traffic staging, and access impacts will be provided in a second notice issued approximately one week prior to the start of construction
