



Tree pest caterpillar control program continues

We will continue our tree pest caterpillar control program Thursday night at 8:30 p.m. in Insect Management Areas 38 (Deer Lodge, King Edward) and 14 (Kingston Crescent, Minnetonka, Norberry, Pulberry, Victoria Crescent). Yesterday evening, we completed treatment in Insect Management Area 42 (Daniel McIntyre, Spence). We expect to spray on weekdays for the next week. We will only spray if weather conditions allow.

We apply *Bacillus thuringiensis* subspecies *kurstaki* (Btk), a biological, organic product from high-pressure sprayers directly onto the foliage of the trees. Once Btk is ingested by the tree pest caterpillars, they stop feeding and die approximately three days later.

This product has been approved for use in Canada by Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency and will be used in accordance with federally approved label directions by licensed pesticide applicators.

Buffer zones

Buffer zones make it so we can't apply Btk within 30 metres of a specific property.

Residents can apply for a buffer zone adjacent to their principal residence. Applications must include a letter and photo ID linking you to the address in question. They can be submitted:
