Please note: Unless marked by a W or a *, assume the birds is a migrant or vagrant to the area.

- * = $\frac{\text{Breeder or probable breeder}}{\text{in area}}$
- H* = <u>Historical breeder</u>. Used to breed in area, but not in recent years.
- *? = Present breeding status uncertain.
- X = Extirpated. Historically regular in area but not seen at all in past 5-10 years
- ! = <u>Probably domestic</u> released/escaped birds.
- $W = \frac{Winter}{only from November to April.}$
- $A = \frac{Abundant}{in \text{ proper season \& habitat.}}$
- C = Common- usually easy to find in proper season & habitat.
- F = Fairly common- usually able to find a few individuals each
- year
 - in proper season & habitat.
- U = <u>Uncommon</u>. This category includes both: a) birds expected to be seen each year but in small numbers and b) birds that may not be seen every year.
- R = <u>Rare</u>. Either: a) only 1-3 reported records in area since 1980 or b) possible, but not expected annually.
- I = Irruptive species. May occur in large numbers one year and be absent the next.
- ? = <u>Abundance/ status not certain</u>. (due to lack of recent records)

Disclaimer: This list is not claiming to be a scientific assessment of the birds in the St. Vital park area. It is anecdotal in that no scientific or statistical methods were used to arrive at each species abundance or breeding status.

Species abundance is a rough, subjective (anecdotal) estimate made by the author largely based on he and his father's extensive personal experience and records in the area in the late 1980's and throughout the 1990's—and also includes data collected from other experienced birders.

Having said that, however, please note that this list only includes species with confirmed sightings – the vast majority (and all of the accidental sightings) made by experienced birders.
