### 1.0 Introduction

The City of Winnipeg (the City) is revisiting the topic of a playground in the Oaks neighbourhood. A previous neighbourhood survey conducted in 2015 revealed a strong division in the community over the playground. With no clear results or community preference from the 2015 survey, the playground was put on hold. The City issued a survey in October 2017 to revisit the neighbourhood's interest in a small playground, complete with a slide, two stand-alone play components, two benches, and a swing set. This report provides an analysis of the input received from the 2017 neighbourhood survey.

### 2.0 Engagement Activities

An online survey was conducted to gauge the level of interest in the Oaks neighbourhood for a playground. Postcards (example in Appendix A), delivered to 189 households, invited residents to complete the online survey (Appendix B). Postcard delivery is shown on Figure 1 below. Each postcard contained the house address and a unique survey URL assigned to that house address. Unique survey URLs were used to ensure only one survey was completed per household. Several households requested a hard copy, so several surveys were sent through the mail.

Households were given approximately one month to complete the survey. A total of 77 households completed the survey. The survey data was analyzed using the online survey tool and is presented in Section 3.0 through graphs and figures. Answers to open-ended questions were grouped according to similar ideas. Each group was then assigned a theme, which captures the main idea shared among all comments in that group. The themes are summarized in Section 3.0. Several verbatim comments from each theme were selected to represent key ideas and provide examples of what respondents said. Full survey responses are contained in Appendix C.

### 3.0 Results

The first question of the survey asked residents to answer what they like most about their neighbourhood. Responses varied but there were four consistent themes within the responses to this open-ended question: quiet, nature, country feeling, and neighbours and community. Safety was also noted by several respondents as something they like about the neighbourhood. Key themes along with examples of responses are listed below. The common ground shown by overlapping responses to this question indicates that neighbours appreciate similar aspects of their neighbourhood.

### Quiet (34):

- Quiet neighbourhood located in a natural setting.
- We love the calm, quiet streets and the natural surroundings.

### Nature (27):

- We like the natural feel, the wilderness, living outside of the city, the wild animals we see, the quietness, the natural look, the trees.
- The quiet, solitude, uninterrupted views of the forest and nature.

### Country feeling (14):

- It feels like you are in the country or established area and not a new development.
- Country living on edge of city.

#### Neighbours and Community (8):

• I like the fact that its natural, feels like being in the countryside and the fact that we have amazing friends and neighbours.




### Park Use

Respondents were asked about how frequently they use the park in the Oaks neighbourhood. Over one third of respondents indicated they visit the park every day, while 21% of respondents have never visited the park.




### **Level of Support**

Respondents were next asked to indicate their level of support for a small playground in the Oaks neighbourhood. Support in the community was split with 51% of respondents supporting a playground, while 45% of respondents opposed a playground.



### **Reasons for Support**


Respondents in support of a small playground were given the opportunity to share why they think a small playground is a great idea. Written responses were grouped by key ideas. The top reason residents support a small playground is that it will be a meeting place for families to get to know their neighbours.

### **Reason for Opposition**


Respondents in opposition of a small playground were given the opportunity to share why they think a small playground is not a good idea. Written responses were grouped by key ideas. The top reason residents opposed a small playground is over nuisance concerns including noise, littering and crime.



\*Other reasons included: safety concerns, and a preference for upgrades to the existing pathway network.


### **Colour Preference**

Respondents in support of a playground where asked for their colour preference. The majority of respondents indicated a preference for natural coloured playground equipment while only 3% preferred bold colours. Other respondents generally indicated that colour was not important and indicated good design and safety as higher priorities.



### Children

Respondents were asked if they have or look after children under the age of twelve. Forty five percent (45%) of respondents indicated they have or look after children under the age of twelve.



### **Correlation between Children and Playground Support**

Additional analysis was conducted on the level of support for a playground. Of the respondents who have or look after children, 76% supported the playground, while 21% did not support the playground. Of the respondents who do not have or look after children, 29% supported the playground, while 66% did not support the playground.

### 4.0 Conclusion

Public input gathered from the online survey demonstrates divided opinions on the installation of a small playground in the Oaks neighbourhood. With 51% of respondents supporting a playground and 45% of respondents opposing a playground, there is no clear preference from residents in the neighbourhood. Respondents in support of a playground explained that there is need for a place to meet neighbours in the community and area for children to play. Respondents in opposition to a playground explained that there is an abundance of private playgrounds in residents' backyards and shared concerns of nuisances such as noise, litter, and crime. Despite differences in opinion with regards to a small playground, there was significant common ground with regards to what respondents like about their neighbourhood, signifying that there are common values within the neighbourhood.


