


# Q1 Do you understand the proposed traffic calming improvements along Gertrude Avenue between Nassau Street North and Osborne Street?



## Q2 Do you have any concerns about the proposed changes?



1	They shouldn't be expanded further down Gertrude to Wellington. Cars come flying down Gertrude trying to cut through to Osborne - often completely missing the four way stop at Daly and Gertrude! Please consider extending this initiative two more blocks	10/31/2021 7:14 AM
2	Observing school traffic, the only children crossing the street mid-block are the ones being driven to school. Also speeds you note don't seem excessive, except during school zone times. We have parking issues already on the street such that residents have no availability and removing 1-2 spaces will only make that worse, especially since school staff park on the street while spaces are available in their parking lot. Also, what is the impact to emergency vehicles as WFPS uses Gertrude to get to certain addresses on Wellington and beyond. If anything, we have an enforcement (lack) issue and an overall planning issue. 
# Q3 Do you believe the proposed traffic management measures will improve quality of life in the surrounding community?


# Q4 Do you feel you had an opportunity to provide input into decision making?





#### Key question: Do you understand this project need?

#### Speed (10)

- There's a feeling that neighbourhood streets are a labyrinth. Gertrude is a straight-shot and might encourage speeds.
- Think people drive too fast. Driver indicated he knows area is deliberate about driving slow on this street.
- Drivers coming from Wellington may forget to slow down
- Would like to have as many speed tables as possible
- Speeds outside of the school zone hours are not an issue the communications materials were misleading
- Very supportive of the proposal; vehicles need to slow down during school hours
- There is way more speeding happening on evenings and weekends; don't see it too much during the day
- The issue with speeds is during rush hour and off-peak hours
- Speeding has been worse since the bar opened up on the corner of the street
- No issues but support the change to reduce speeds

#### Pedestrian crossing (6)

- When there's a snowbank out front, the crossing at the school is better
- Questioned if a four-way stop was possible at the intersection of Nassau St. uncomfortable crossing. Confusion about pedestrian navigation at the roundabout.
- Questioned if school crossing would include a flashing light.
- Have never seen a pedestrian accident in 11 years—the issue is when cars are backed up and kids try to cross between stopped cars
- Really like the raised pedestrian crossing and curb extension
- Worried about kids, dogs on the street

#### Key question: Do you have concerns about the proposed design?



#### Traffic volume (8)

- Volume is the main issue, we need a bigger picture study that looks at the whole neighbourhood and how to reduce shortcutting
- Would like to see another through-street in the neighbourhood so traffic wouldn't cut through on Gertrude
- Concerned this will cause more frustration for the community as it doesn't address the fact that this is a thoroughfare
- Volume of traffic on the street is the number one issue
- Concerned there is now overarching plan for the area; would like to close off Gertrude at Wellington to reduce traffic volume
- Not sure if these changes will make an improvement this is a busy street and neighbourhood
- During the day, you see a lot of "short cutting". Daytime hours are the worst. Concern about road users being frustrated about congestion.
- Shortcutters are the ones who are speeding. Remove short-cutters and there won't be a speed issue.

#### Emergency vehicles (2)

- Concerned about the impact on fire trucks
- Concerned this may force emergency vehicles to slow down

#### Raised crosswalk (1)

• A crosswalk is not a good solution. Won't work in the winter when there are snowbanks.

#### Speed (1)

 Would like to see solutions that address speed on the entire corridor and not just these two spots

#### Key question: How would the proposed changes affect your quality of life/street use?

#### Parking (2)

- Concerned about the loss of parking. Parking is in high demand. Multi-family developments should provide parking for their residents.
- Concerned about the possible loss of parking

#### Other comments:

• Noted school has low participant participation



- Felt lied to/not meaningfully engaged when traffic circles were installed
- Is this a meaningful phase of engagement?
- Would like the City to explore ways to address the issue digitally. E.g., have mapping apps not direct traffic down Gertrude
- The sign for the school zone is on the other side of Osborne, so many people don't know it's a school zone when the turn onto the street
- School loading with double parking can be an issue


