Phase 2 Community Engagement Summary

March 2024

#### **Background**

Bridge Lake Drive was identified as a high-priority location for traffic calming measures through the City's Traffic Calming Program.

We collected traffic data on Bridge Lake Drive between North Town Road and Eagleview Road in April, 2019:

- The 85th percentile speed, which is the speed at which 85 percent of motorists travel at or below, is 56 km/h
- About 340 vehicles travel 55 km/h or faster every day
  - A third of these vehicles travel faster than 60 km/h

Traffic calming measures will be installed on Bridge Lake Drive to help slow speeds and create a safer space for all road users.

#### **Engagement**

In Summer 2023, we asked community members to complete a survey. This survey helped us understand how they feel about the street's current state and issues.

We developed a proposed traffic calming design based on what we heard. The design included speed tables, raised crosswalks, curb extensions, sidewalk improvements and improved parking signage.

In early 2024, we presented this proposed design to the community for their feedback. An online survey was open from January 10-31, 2024. We received nine responses.

#### **Promotion**

The survey was promoted using:

- Project webpage winnipeg.ca/bridgelakecalming updated January 10, 2024
- Direct-mailed postcards to 54 nearby properties with an invitation to take the survey January 10, 2024
- On-street signage notifying residents that traffic calming measures are coming – installed during the week of June 26, 2023 and left in place throughout Phase 2
- An email to 10 individuals who previously signed up for project updates – January 10, 2024

#### **Key Findings**

The findings below are based on nine surveys out of 54 notified properties. We recognize this is a small sample.


- Respondents understand the proposed changes.
- Some are concerned with the proposed changes.
- Seven out of nine respondents feel the proposed measures will improve the quality of life of the surrounding community.

#### **Online survey results**

While all nine respondents understand the proposed changes to Bridge Lake Drive, four expressed concerns (see Figure 1).

Total responses: 9

Respondents who answered "yes" had the opportunity to explain why in an open-ended format. Concerns included:

- Need for speed enforcement
- Concern that speed tables/raised crosswalks will damage vehicles
- Concern that traffic calming measures will encourage increased traffic volumes on other roads

When asked whether they believed the proposed traffic calming measures would improve the quality of life in the surrounding community, seven out of nine respondents either strongly agreed or agreed (see Figure 2).




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Figure 2: Quality of life

The traffic calming design is intended to better align operating speeds with the speed limit. It is not expected to significantly reduce traffic volumes by diverting motorists to adjacent streets. Bridge Lake Drive is still intended to operate as a neighbourhood collector street.
Frustration that drivers are idling near bus stops to pick up students.	We reviewed parking signs on Bridge Lake Drive based on feedback from Phase 1 engagement. Additional signage was installed to clarify where parking is prohibited. If motorists are parking or stopping illegally, residents can contact 311 to request enforcement from the Winnipeg Parking Authority.

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#### **Next Steps**

What we heard will help up refine the final design, which will be presented for information and implementation as early as the 2024 construction season.






# Q1 Do you understand the proposed traffic calming improvements on Bridge Lake Drive between North Town Road and Eagleview Road?








